


Haematology 'new patient' clinic

Information for patients



Welcome to the Haematology department

You have been referred to the 'new patient' clinic.

The new patient clinic sees people with lots of different problems that may be due to disorders of the blood. The clinic is the first step in finding out what is wrong. Our role is to investigate your situation and refer you to the appropriate doctor, depending on what you need.

You might have been referred because of a recent blood test that showed something outside of the normal levels. Or you might have a symptom that could suggest a problem with your blood.

There are many types of blood disorder that are not serious in nature. A diagnosis with a serious blood disorder is rare.

We know that coming to see us might be stressful. This leaflet is to provide more information about what happens next and who is there to support you.

Nurse Specialist

You should contact the Nurse Specialist if you have any concerns about your referral to the clinic, such as worsening of your current symptoms or changes to your health.
